## Pickup Family Neurosciences Institute at Hoag First in Orange County to Offer New Treatment for Obstructive Sleep Apnea

NEWPORT BEACH, Calif., October 25, 2018 --- Pickup Family Neurosciences Institute at Hoag is the first in Orange County to offer a new, cutting-edge treatment option for obstructive sleep apnea (OSA). The Inspire Upper Airway Stimulation therapy is the first implantable device for treating OSA.

"At Hoag, we are always looking for state-of-the-art treatment options to benefit our patients," said <u>Jay Puangco</u>, M.D., service chief at the <u>Judy & Richard Voltmer Sleep Center at the Pickup Family Neurosciences Institute at Hoag</u>. "The Inspire therapy is clinically proven to reduce sleep apnea events allowing our patients to get a more restful night's sleep."

More than 18 million Americans have <u>sleep apnea</u>. Depending on the degree of severity, OSA can be a potentially life-threatening condition. Research shows that a person with poorly managed sleep apnea is at increased risk for heart attack, <u>stroke</u>, weight gain, high blood pressure and <u>heart failure</u>. Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) therapy has been shown to be an effective treatment for sleep apnea, however studies show that roughly half of all patients that start CPAP eventually become non-compliant. A recent study in the Journal of Clinical Sleep Medicine found that hospital readmission rates, for all causes including cardiovascular and pulmonary, in patients with OSA were more than double for those who did not adhere to their CPAP therapy.

In contrast to CPAP, Inspire therapy works with a patient's natural breathing process. The implantable system includes a small generator, a sensing lead and a stimulation lead. Turned on by a handheld remote, it delivers mild stimulation to key airway muscles, which keeps the airway open during sleep.

"This innovative therapy represents a significant advance in sleep apnea treatment and is life-changing for some of our patients who are unable to use CPAP," said <u>Ahmed El-Bershawi</u>, M.D., board certified sleep specialist and service chief at Hoag Sleep Center Irvine.

<u>Hoag Sleep Health Program</u> has been studying and treating more than 5,000 patients with sleep disorders annually for the last 20 years. Hoag's Sleep Centers in Newport Beach and Irvine offer patients access to board certified sleep specialists, registered polysomnographic technologists, bedroom labs, outpatient facilities and advanced diagnostic and treatment technologies.
